Dr. Wes Griffin: Dr. Griffin's ministry has included teaching, pastoring and management of a major international ministry. He and his wife, Joy, co-founded and serve as Directors of International Leadership Institute. This organization spreads the Gospel by training and mobilizing national leaders to reach their own countrymen for Christ.

Raised in Taiwan as the son of missionaries, he has been a pastor, professor, theologian, evangelist and seminary leader. He is presently a professor of Systematic & Historical Theology at Wesley Biblical Seminary. His passion is to incorporate sound Christian theological thinking within the Wesleyan tradition.

Colonel Henry Gariepy: Our Adult Bible Teacher this year has been a career officer with The Salvation Army for over 35 years. He is the author of 26 books, comprising the largest corpus of published works by a Salvation Army author. He's listed in *Who's Who in US Writers* and former editor of *The War Cry*, the national publication of The Salvation Army.

Dr. George Mathison: Indian Springs welcomes Dr. Mathison in his first preaching engagement with us. He has been Senior Pastor of the Auburn United Methodist Church in Auburn, AL, for over 17 years. Many team members, coaches and university students attend his church. He was Team Chaplain for the Auburn University Football Team. After the 9/11 tragedy, he became Chaplain to the Public Safety Department.

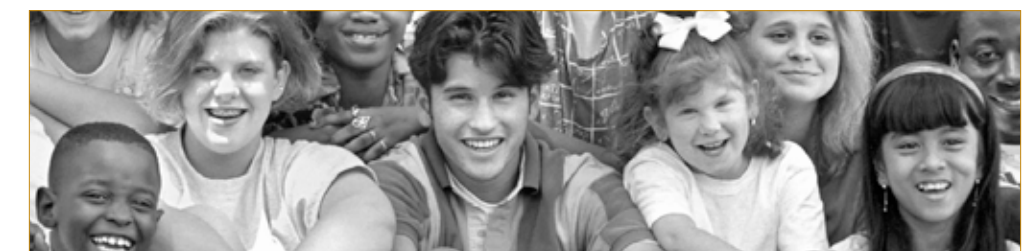

A Tribute to “Mr. Joe” Luce



Indian Springs will not be the same this year without “Mr. Joe” Luce who passed away December 17, 2006. As the grandson of one of the Indian Springs’ founders, Rev.

George W. Mathews, Joe grew up on these grounds and his life was an inspirational witness to the message of Indian Springs.

Indian Springs was etched into each fiber of Joe’s life, and he has left his mark on all aspects of this camp’s ministry. He served on the Board for 50 years.

Eldest son Steve Luce recalled the many “fingerprints” his dad left on the camp.

“Dad was working on the Youth Tabernacle and decided to make a large cross for the back wall as his gift to God.” This 6 foot cross is still there today.

“Many people know me because I build good school buses—I’d rather be known as a missionary.”

Joe is best remembered as President of the camp from 1990-2000, but his influence reached far beyond that. “There was no aspect of the camp’s work that he wasn’t involved in,” said brother Buddy Luce. “He did everything from selecting the preachers to driving the bulldozer.”

“Joe was a visionary who kept his eye on the big picture,” added Vice-President Charles Adams. “He was responsible for so many innovations, from our Youth and Tweens’ ministries to our sewage treatment and water systems. He always held fast to our holiness heritage and traditions.”

“Well done, thou good and faithful servant.”

Hollywood Comes to Indian Springs

There was unusual activity on the grounds of our camp earlier this year. Several of our historic cottages were used as a setting for a Christian-themed movie, “Mrs. Hobbes’ House”, to be released later this year.

The movie tells the story of a self-centered, childless widow who is forced by financial circumstances into an awkward living arrangement with a houseful of foster children. Her heart is won, how-

ever, by the love of the children and their Christian example. Rob Roy MacGregor’s century old cottage was embellished with architectural features to represent the era of the film.

Several of our camp patrons were used as “extras”. Over twelve tractor-trailers of equipment were on the grounds with another 100 or more crew members at any time.

Production personnel working on the project were fascinated by Indian Springs. “I can tell that I am in a very unique and safe place”, one crew member remarked. “It’s like being in Mayberry.”

Dr. Sandra Gray, President of Asbury College, will visit Indian Springs during the first weekend of camp meeting. Elected as the 17th President of the college effective July 2007, she brings more than twenty years of experience within higher education.



Within the 103 colleges of the Coalition of Christina Colleges in the U.S., only 4% have women presidents. The Asbury community warmly welcomed Dr. Gray to the position.

Prior to her involvement at Asbury College, Dr. Gray worked in the banking industry. In 1989, Dr. Gray joined the faculty of Asbury College as a professor of Business Management. She achieved many leadership roles within the college and is a respected academician, as well as a woman of faith. Most recently, she served as Asbury’s Provost of Academic Affairs.

Dr. Gray has always been actively involved with students, faculty and administration. Regardless of her new title, students consider her a mentor, counselor and friend. Former student, Laurence Coppedge, recalls being in Dr. Gray’s classroom. “She was absolutely awesome. Students who weren’t even business majors took her classes because was such a wonderful teacher. Her devotions at the beginning of class were some of my highlights as a student as Asbury.”

“I am excited to come to Indian Springs,” said Dr. Gray. “Since Indian Springs Camp Meeting and Asbury College both began in 1890, there has always been a strong connection between the two. I look forward to meeting many alumni and visiting with prospective students.”
