Last year, the Board of Trustees announced *Foundation to the Future*, a capital campaign to provide funds for projects which will broaden Indian Springs' spiritual impact and influence on our families, churches and communities. Resources from the campaign will help Indian Springs remain an enduring place of spiritual foundation and renewal for future generations. The capital campaign will go through 2024.

The master plan for Foundation to the Future includes renovation and expansion of the RV park, seed funding for the provision of affordable cottages, and development of a safe playground area for our children. In addition, we need to upgrade plumbing and sewer infrastructure. For a total project listing, see Page 2. The capital campaign will provide \$1 million toward all these plans.

Main Tabernacle "Showing Its Age"

Winky Carlock, our caretaker, and various Trustees have been carefully watching changes in our 129-year-old Tabernacle. Excess water around the Tabernacle over the years has caused foundational, structural and drainage issues. The floor has become uneven in many places.

We sought the professional expertise of structural and civil engineers over the last year. They made these recommendations to prevent further water damage in the Tabernacle:

- Install a French drainage system to stop excessive water flow.
- Replace wooden columns as necessary; replace and/or level uneven flooring.
- Restore critical foundational points that support the roof structure.

The Main Tabernacle is the spiritual heart of Indian Springs. Countless lives have been blessed around its altars since 1893 when it was completed on the campground.

MAIN TABERNACLE REPAIRS: \$75,000

Affordable Cottage Fund

To meet future growth at Indian Springs, we must have the ability to accommodate the demand for cottage ownership on our campground.

The Board of Trustees will develop a \$200,000 renewable loan fund that will help families build or purchase a cottage at Indian Springs.


A Time and Place to Play!

An exciting capital campaign project is a playground that will enrich children's imaginative play right here on the campground. The safe and creative equipment will be supplied by a nationally renowned developer of play and recreation equipment. The location will be between the present Nursery and the Folds Nursery, and spans approximately 45° x 60° .

Playground features include a resilient rubber flooring and a secure lockable fence. Benches will be placed on the edge of the perimeter where parents, grandparents and friends can comfortably engage and watch the children play.

Danae Gambill, who helped the Capital Campaign Committee research the equipment said, "The playground will be a place where generations can connect. The durability of the new equipment will also ensure that we can use this playground for years to come!"





Campground leaders of past years built our plumbing and sewer system with picks and shovels. They did not have a master plan to follow. In spite of challenging budget restrictions and limited pipe materials during war years, a water and sewer system developed across the campground.

Now, decades later, Indian Springs has many challenges with our pipes and sewer lines:

- Pipes are inconsistent materials and sizes throughout the campground; many are broken.
- Plumbing line locations are often unknown or inaccessible, and may be under roads or buildings.
- Plumbing problems are costly and disruptive to the campground. Blockages and overflows typically occur when the system goes online and the most people are around!

The Board is currently developing a master plan that covers existing facilities and future growth of cottages. The plan includes replacing many water and sewer lines. Campaign funds for infrastructure needs will enable us to avoid service disruptions and repairs that are time-consuming and expensive.

Kudos to Georgia Rural Water Association!

Recently, Indian Springs partnered with the Georgia Rural Water Association (GRWA) to repair and plan for future expansion of our plumbing and sewer system. Founded in the later 1970s and led by Jay Matthews and his father, Jimmy, GRWA is a non-profit organization that represents Georgia rural systems in regard to drinking water and wastewater needs.

For several years, the Board of Trustees has been studying the status and future needs of our plumbing and sewer system. Many of our water lines date back to the early days of the campground,

and they are in need of repair. While the wastewater system is sufficient to handle current capacity, the infrastructure leading to it needs attention. Through relationships with Trustees Joe Harris and Matthew Gambill, GRWA was contacted for help.

To date, GRWA has identified several immediate repairs and have generously helped us fix them. One repair involved digging under State Hwy 42. GRWA and the Georgia Department of Transportation stepped in with their equipment to make the time-consuming repair. Now cottage holders across Hwy 42 have water restored to their cottages.

The Board of Trustees thanks Jay and Jimmy Matthews and the GRWA for their expertise. We are grateful to the former Bartow County Water Department Superintendent, Gene Camp, who also donated a considerable amount of time assisting GRWA and advising us on needed improvements. Indian Springs deeply appreciates the leadership and contribution of these gentlemen.
